Everyone will be expected to adhere to the one way system around the school grounds and to avoid lingering, therefore causing pinch points. If you are waiting outside a classroom, please stand with a space, respecting distance between yourself and others. The systems we had prior to this current lockdown worked successfully because our families followed them so conscientiously, so we are hoping that these will continue to be maintained to the same standard once everyone returns.

We are planning a range of lovely activities to welcome children and settle them back into school quickly. Please remember all school books need to be returned on Monday 8th March. In the meantime keep up the great work you are doing at home with your children and keep safe.
