Reading support

We know that being able to read underpins everything a child does in school and is directly linked to their self-esteem, confidence and achievements as they go through life.

In order to support your child with reading, please ensure they are reading at home at least three times a week. Any child from Year 2-6 who does not read three times a week will join our reading workshop during Friday breaktime to practise reading. However we know learning to read is best taught on a one-to-one basis, so giving your child a bit of shared reading time every day will make a big difference.

Free School Meals

Your child will be able to get Free School Meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- . Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum . Act
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 . your household earnings must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
